





The Pittsburgh Savoyards, Inc. is a dues paying membership organization. Our purpose is to promote, preserve and present G&S musical productions, and provide educational and performance opportunities. Members are required to pay an annual membership fee. If you are offered a role or chorus position and accept, you must pay a \$5.00 membership fee (per season \*July–June). We are a volunteer group and expect our members to participate according to their skills and interests. We always have a need for active members both performing (on stage and in the orchestra) and non–performing members to help us build scenery, props, sew costumes, raise money, or other responsibilities necessary to make our production successful. If you know of someone who may like to participate with the Pittsburgh Savoyards, please let us know.

**Instructions for Audition:** First, sign in on the numbered sign in sheet provided at the sign in location where you found this form.

You will be called in the order that you arrived and signed in. Please wait to be called for your turn to audition.

- ◆ At the sign–in table, you may find some additional notes from the directors stating that they would like to do something impromptu as a part of your audition. If the directors for the show have decided to do this, there will be a note (or notes) with the numbered sign in sheet, explaining what they would like you to do, in addition to your prepared song. (Not every group of directors does this, so there may not be any extra notes or business during the audition.)
- ◆ While you wait to be called, fill out the form on the other side of this paper to the best of your ability with the information you have with you today so your information may be available to the director(s) during the audition.
- ◆ **Please Note Privacy:** 1) A “Cast List Contact Sheet” will be distributed to all necessary production members for each show. Contact Information contained is considered confidential. If you have contact information that you do Not want to be distributed, indicate it on your form with alternate means to contact you.  
2)Your **name/role** may also be listed in the program and/or press releases, but contact information will not be used .
- ◆ You are invited to attach a resume and/or headshot to the form, if you have brought one; however, neither is required for the audition. Photos are normally kept with your audition form. Once it is filled out, one of the people coordinating the audition process will take an electronic copy of all your contact info before you go into the Audition space to make it easier and faster to contact you. Once we have collected this information, you may do what you need to feel ready to do your audition.
- ◆ Some people prefer to prepare alone or warm up their voice or go over their piece one last time, others prefer to socialize; please respect each persons needs.
- ◆ You will be called into a staging area when you are next. Usually you will be alone, just outside the audition room, but other groups may also be in the theatre in rehearsal. Please respect the work that may be being done while you wait. If you wish, another person may accompany you into the audition. Although this is not normal, it will be respected, if it is handled in a professional manner. If you are a young adult (under 18), this is encouraged, as there may be some questions the directors may need to ask about your time from your parents/guardians, there are restrictions on young performers. If you are an adult with children at the audition, please bring someone to watch them while you audition, the people running auditions will not be able to watch them for you, they have their hands full enough running the auditions.
- ◆ Hand your music to the accompanist and give any notes about your piece to them, and then give this audition form to the directors, their assistant or the production manager. Guests may sit to the side, out of the staff’s way. Take whatever time you need to compose yourself and then introduce yourself (full name) and what you are going to perform. (This includes the name of the song; what it is from, if it is a tune from a show; and the name of the Character that sings the part, if it is from a show; etc.) When you are ready to sing, signal the accompanist. If you are uncomfortable about the way the accompanist is playing your piece, please stop them, and help them understand what you would like changed.  
This is YOUR audition. You should feel comfortable with it, and we will make every effort to help you make it so.
- ◆ When you finish singing, thank the directors, and wait to see if they have any questions or other work they wish to see you do. You may ask them questions as well, but please be as brief as possible, as others are waiting and there will be other opportunities to ask questions once rehearsals start. They will thank and dismiss you when they have no more questions.

**If you are offered a part by the directors, you will be required to sign a contract and abide by the rules set forth in it and any other rules of the organization, the hall, and the various laws of the Governments of the United States under which there is such jurisdiction over the group or individuals involved. Rules of the Hall are posted in one or more of: backstage, dressing rooms, rehearsal space; and must be followed, ask if you cannot find them. Rules of the organization will be made clear in the contract and at the first rehearsal, and may be provided you on paper at a future date.**
